Background

As part of the HSCICs ongoing commitment to transparency, it publishes a quarterly register of all releases made under a data sharing agreement. This details the organisations who have received data, the type of data (whether it is hospital, mental health, workforce data etc.), the legal basis for sharing and the purpose to which the applicant is permitted to put it. Also included in the registers is the number of law enforcement agencies' person tracing requests processed by the National Back Office (NBO).

The first iteration of the register, published 2nd July 2014 covered data releases made between 1st April 2014- 31st March 2014. The second iteration, published on 6th October 2014 covered data releases made between 1st April 2014 – 30th June 2014. The third iteration, published on 14th January 2015 covers data releases made between 1st July 2014 – 30th September 2014.

This report has been created to inform the Board of the January publication and to provide summary information of its content.
